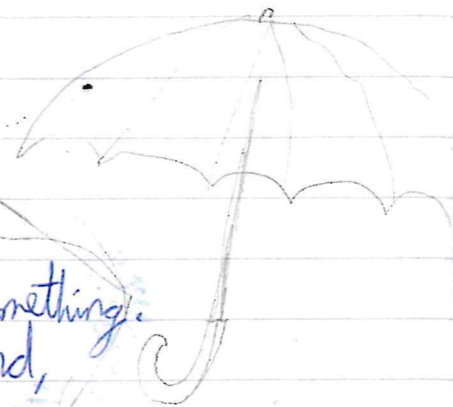

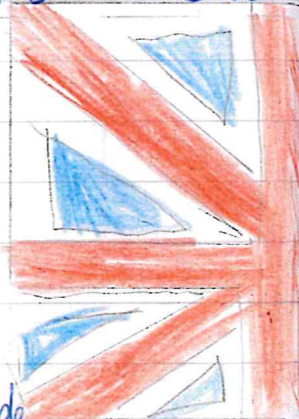
Britain's Flag origin

Weather and Climate

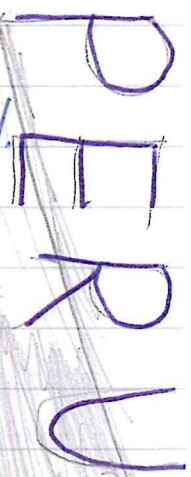
