Jewellery In School

Just a reminder that the only jewellery which can be worn in school by pupils is a watch and/or stud earrings. All items of jewellery must be removed prior to children taking part in PE lessons for health and safety reasons. Earrings may be covered for the first 6 weeks after piercing, however after that time, earrings **must** be removed. If a child is unable to remove their earrings themselves, we suggest that they do not wear them to school on PE days. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
