Children should bring their entry into school on Thursday 2^{nd} March where a winner will be chosen from each class who will receive a prize. We will also be holding a book exchange where each child can bring in a book that they no longer want and exchange it for a different one – books should be brought in on the morning of World Book Day.

Swimming

After half term, Class 3 will be taking part in swimming lessons at Wolsingham Pool. Class 4 children have now completed their swimming sessions until next academic year. Class 3 children will be swimming on Tuesday afternoons setting off at 12.40pm and returning to school by 2.20pm. We would be grateful if they could bring their swimming kit consisting of a towel, trunks (not shorts) or costume and swimming hat (essential) each Tuesday beginning on Tuesday 28th February.

New Climbing Equipment for EYFS

On Monday 27th February, work will begin to replace the old trim trail equipment in the EYFS area. The new equipment will be funded by the Sports Premium and will provide our youngest children with equipment which will better support their physical development and enable them to develop their core strength. There will be a barrier in place and work will cease whilst Nursery children are dropped off and picked up. We would like to ask our Nursery parents to help us to ensure the safety of the children by supervising them closely during these times. Our Reception children will use other areas of the school grounds whilst it is being installed.

Parent Teacher Consultations

Parent Teacher Consultations will take place from **Monday 6th March**. Parents should have received a text message or email with a link to make their own appointment online via Teachers2Parents, the same system we use for text messages. We are offering a 10 minute appointment with the class teacher to update parents on their progress and current targets. We would be grateful if parents help us to stick to our 10 minute time slots and make an additional appointment with the class teacher, via the school office, if there is an issue which requires further discussion. In the week beginning 13th March, Nursery will be holding Stay and Play sessions which are 1 hour sessions when a parent can come into Nursery to play alongside their child, as well as speak to their child's key worker about their child's interests and what they could do to help them develop at home. Parents should have received an email with further details about how to book.

Holiday Childcare

Thank you to all those who booked a place at holiday childcare over the February half term. Unfortunately, we did not have enough interest for the Thursday session and therefore cancelled it, letting all those who had already booked a session know. Holiday Club therefore will only run on Wednesday 22nd February. Please note that due to health and safety reasons, we are not able to accept children who have not already made a booking with the school office.


