The staff and children have all made a fantastic start to the year and are already hard at work. There is a lovely quiet and productive atmosphere throughout the school. As always, our aim is to continue to instil in all of the children the need to do everything to the very best of their ability, further developing their learning behaviours, so that they can become increasingly independent and take control of their own learning. The expectations of all of the staff will be very high in all aspects of school life from remembering PE kits to learning weekly spellings and completing homework. We want the children of Wolsingham Primary School to have a thirst for knowledge and know what they need to do to improve. We expect our children to complete every piece of work to the highest standard possible. It should be another exciting year!

Just a reminder that it is essential that all children have their PE kits and water bottles in school at all times. Just a reminder that if your child has had their ears pierced over the summer break, they must be covered for PE sessions until a period of 6 weeks following the piercing and then they MUST be removed for PE sessions. If your child is not able to remove their earrings themselves, then we recommend that they do not come to school wearing them on days when they take part in PE sessions (including swimming). For health and safety reasons, all earrings worn in school must be studs only and no bracelets or necklaces should be worn.

If you have not already done so, please ensure that your child has brought back to school any school reading books that they had at home. Thank you.

Nuts in School

Please remember that ALL nuts or products containing nuts are not allowed in our school or school visits in the form of snacks or in packed lunches. We do have some children who will have an allergic reaction to nuts in any form and this may cause serious harm to them. Thank you for helping to keep our children safe.

Payments to School

We would like to remind parents that payments for school lunches and wrap around care must be paid via ParentPay on a weekly basis. Invoices not paid on time may result in access to services being removed.

Green Nuggets

You may have been hearing children talking about 'Green Nuggets' upon their return to school. This is a new system we have brought in to reward the children for their good behaviour and manners in the classroom and around the school. Children must work as a class to earn green nuggets which will be placed in their class jar. When they reach each milestone, they will receive a class reward as agreed between them and the class teacher. The children have made a brilliant start to earning them. This system will replace the Green Time that has historically taken place on a Friday afternoon.

Forest School

It was such as shame that Covid got in the way of our Forest School development across the school. Therefore, we are keen to get this up and running again so that each class can experience it across the school year. This year we have a Forest Schools Leader coming into school on a Thursday afternoon to carry out activities with the children. Each class will work with Sarah across a half term starting with the children in Class 3 (Year 2). Parents will be sent further information about any equipment their child might need via email.

After School Activities

We are in the process of organising our After School Activities for this half term and more details and booking links will be sent out via email next week. As our new Reception children get used to coming to school full time and are often tired at the end of the school day, particularly in the Autumn term. After school activities offered in the autumn term are therefore only available for pupils in Year 1 to Year 6 pupils.

Key Stage 2 Choir

This year a singing specialist will be working with us to develop a Key Stage 2 choir. Sessions will take place after school on Mondays from 3.15pm until 4pm starting from Monday 11th September. It is a wonderful opportunity for our children to learn some new songs have a good old sing song! All Key Stage 2 children are welcome to join in. Applications for primary and secondary places opened on Tuesday 5th September. Applications close at midnight on 15th January 2024 (primary) and 31st October 2023 (secondary). Swimming Sessions

Class 6 will be swimming on Tuesday afternoons this term. Children will require a swimming kit consisting of a one piece swim suit or trunks (not shorts), a towel and swimming hat which is essential. Goggles are permitted, but are not essential.

School Lunch Payments

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that school lunches this year cost £2.50 per day and should be paid for on the **Monday** of each week or at the beginning of the term if you wish to pay for the whole term at once. A reminder to parents of our Year 3 children that free school lunches are only for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and therefore lunches for Year 3 children will be charged.

Holidays in Term Time

Regular attendance at school is essential if children are to make good progress in their learning. Any absence from school can have such a huge impact on the progress they make. We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that holidays in term time **will not** be authorised. Unfortunately, on occasions, parents report their child's absence as illness rather than completing the Pupil Leave of Absence form. If we have reason to believe that an absence has been due to holiday rather than illness, these absences will be recorded as unauthorised. Any case of irregular attendance due to unauthorised leave of absence in term time of **7 school days for more** in a minimum 12 rolling school week period **will** be referred to the Attendance Improvement Team to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice. We would also like to remind parents that non-urgent medical and dental appointments wherever possible should also be made out of school hours.

Changing from Lunchtime Arrangements

As the ingredients for our school lunches are pre-ordered it is important that we have at least one week's notice regarding any children changing from school lunch to packed lunch or vice versa, even following the summer break. We would be grateful if parents could contact the school office to make the necessary arrangements.

Meet the Teacher Night – including information about Statutory AssessmentsParents and carers of children in Years 1-6 are warmly invited to our 'Meet the Teacher Night' on **Monday 18**th **September at 5.00pm**. Teachers will be explaining class procedures and providing important information where appropriate about statutory assessments such as the Year 1 phonics check, Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check and KS2 SATs. The meeting should last no longer than half an hour and is for **parents and carers only**; please try and attend if you can. We look forward to seeing you!
