#### **Parent Teacher Consultation Appointments**

Parent Teacher Consultations will take place from **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November**. As we are in the process of transferring to Arbor as our communication system, this time the system for making appointments will be slightly different. Parents should have received an email with a link to an online form. We would be grateful if parents would indicate on the form all of the days and time slots (in half hour time frames) that they would be able to attend. We will then make the appointments and let you know via text when your appointment is. We are offering a **10 minute** appointment with the class teacher to update parents on how their child has settled in, their progress and current targets. We would be grateful if parents help us to stick to our **10 minute** time slots and make an additional appointment with the class teacher, via the school office, if there is an issue which requires further discussion.

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October is Halloween Dress Up Day. We are inviting all of our children to come to school on that day in their Halloween costumes – remember costumes don't have to be bought. #### 'Think before you post'

"We ask that social media, whether public or private, should not be used to fuel campaigns and voice complaints against the school, school staff, parents or children. Online activity which we consider inappropriate:

- Identifying or posting images/videos of children without permission
- Abusive or personal comments about staff, governors, children or other parents
- Bringing the school in disrepute
- Posting defamatory or libellous comments
- Emails circulated or sent directly with abusive or personal comments about staff or children
- Using social media to publicly challenge school policies or discuss issues about individual children or members of staff
- Threatening behaviour, such as verbally intimidating staff, or using bad language
- Breaching school security procedures

In serious cases the school and the Local Authority will also consider its legal options to deal with any such misuse of social networking and other sites. This extends to any other defamatory or libellous behaviours."

You may remember that last March we introduced our Respect Policy. Part of this policy includes online behaviour – see above. We have been made aware that once again some parents are discussing or making comments about other people's children online – this includes via social media such as WhatsApp groups. Comments made about other children cause unnecessary distress to both the children involved and their parents, therefore we would urge parents not to post or take part in such online discussions. If you feel there is an issue between children at school, please contact your child's class teacher to discuss the matter.
