

Year 1: Spring 2

Dear Parents.



Here are some of the activities we will be covering this half-term. This overview does not include everything that we will be doing, but hopefully it will give you an insight into some of the learning which will be taking place in our classroom.

English

We will be looking at information texts, traditional tales and poetry

We will continue to focus on writing simple sentences and practise the following skills:

- Sit letters on the line
- Put finger spaces between words
- Capital letters at the start of sentences and names of people, places, days of week and months of year.
- End sentences with a full stop
- Putting a question mark at the end of questions.
- Time words to sequence events, e.g. first, next, then, etc.
- Using describing words to write character descriptions.
- Using 'and' to join two short sentences together to make a longer sentence.
- Identifying rhyming words and continuing a string of rhyming words.

Mathematics

Number and place value

- Value of digits in 2-digit numbers how many tens? How many ones?
- Finding 1 more and 1 less than 2-digit numbers.
- Putting 2-digit numbers in order.
- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Recognising odd and even numbers.

Calculations - Multiplication and Division

- Understanding multiplication as repeated addition, e.g. 2+2+2 = 3 lots of 2 = 3x2
- Understanding multiplication as describing an array, e.g. 4x3 = 4 rows of 3.
- Developing quick recall of multiplication facts from x2, x5 and x10 tables.
- Understanding division as sharing and finding the answers to division calculations by physically sharing out objects.

Measures - length

- Using language to compare length, e.g. long, longer, longer, short, shorter, shortest, etc
- Measuring length of objects in non-standard units, e.g. how many cubes long is the pen?.
- Measuring length in metres identifying things that are longer or shorter than 1 metre, measuring how many metres long the corridor or playground are

Measuring length in centimetres.
