Parking

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that the school car park is for staff and visitors only and should not be used to drop children off or pick children up from Breakfast Club and After School Club. We would also like to ask parents who park on Lydgate Lane to park considerately when dropping off and collecting children. We have been made aware that cars are being parked on both sides of the road leaving no space for cars to drive down Lydgate Lane. We would also like to ask that parents consider carefully whether their parking hinders parents and children walking safely to and from the school. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Birthday Treats

It is lovely that some of our parents like to send a treat into school for their child's class when it is their birthday, however as a school we must ensure that we carefully monitor this as we have children in school with severe allergies. Therefore, if you would like to send something into school, please ensure that it is bought from a shop with clear ingredients and preparation information detailed on the packaging. No items should contain nuts or traces of nuts. Individual cakes or small packets of sweets are easier for the class teacher to distribute and if whole cakes are sent in, then they should be cut into portions prior to being sent into school.

Halloween Disco

Children from Reception to Year 6 should have brought home a letter this week about the Halloween Discos taking place on Thursday 23rd October. Is My Child Too III for School?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school or nursery when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school each day. Let us know that your child won't be in and give us the reason. If your child is well enough to come school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let us know. 


